302	Victory over German invaders in the territory of the Lingones	<i>Pan. Lat.</i> 6(7).6.2; <i>CIL</i> 10.3343 (date)
303	German victory near Vindonissa	<i>Pan. Lat.</i> 6(7).6.3
304, late winter	Victory over German raiders who had crossed the frozen Rhine	<i>Pan. Lat.</i> 6(7).6.4
305	Crosses from Boulogne to Britain, and campaigns against the Picts	<i>Pan. Lat.</i> 6(7).7.1 ff.; <i>Origo</i> 4; <i>AE</i> 1961.240 (before Jan. 7, 306)
306, July 25	Dies at York	<i>CIL</i> 1, pp. 268, 269; <i>Chr. Min.</i> 1.231; Socrates, <i>HE</i> 1.2.1 (day); Eutropius, <i>Brev.</i> 10.1.3; Jerome, <i>Chronicle</i> 228 (place)
