

Constantius II Chart

The tables below are reproductions and syntheses of the charts found in chapter V of *The New Empire of Diocletian and Constantine* (Cambridge: Harvard University Press, 1982) and appendix 9 of *Athanasius and Constantius: Theology and Politics in the Constantinian Empire* (Cambridge: Harvard University Press, 1993) both by T.D. Barnes. Preference was given to *Athanasius and Constantius* where differences exist. Minor stylistic changes have been made to improve consistency.
